
















WHO WE ARE

WHAT'S NEW?

In 2024, CRPD welcomed its newest generation of parks.

Here are the new parks in your community!

HUMMINGBIRD PARK

Opened in January 2024 in Anatolia, Hummingbird Park embraces a nature-inspired design. It features a half basketball court, a children's play area, a picnic spot and an oval turf field ideal for recreation.



GOLD RUSH PARK

Opened in May 2024, Gold Rush Park gives a playful nod to California's history. This is CRPD's first park in the Rio Del Oro Development. Highlights include a shaded play structure, picnic spaces, a multi-use field and unique themed elements like a minecart, digging equipment and a charming miniature mine.

AURA PARK

Opened in August 2024, Aura Park adds a nature-focused retreat to The Ranch Development. The park offers a shaded playground, a half basketball court, a covered picnic area and a multi-purpose field, creating a family-friendly outdoor haven for the community.



ROCKROSE PARK

Opened in November 2024, Rockrose Park offers a tranquil open space for the community to enjoy. Its multi-use field and inviting picnic areas make it an ideal spot for spending quality time outdoors with friends and family.

EXPLORATION PARK

Opened in November 2024, Exploration Park takes inspiration from its name, providing adventurous spaces in The Ranch Development. Key features include a large shaded play structure, pickleball courts, a half basketball court, picnic areas, an open field and artistic sculptures for discovery and play.

SEEDS OF CHANGE

CRPD staff joined residents at Sonoma Park to plant three Trident Maples in memory of Eugene McCann, a beloved local resident and frequent visitor to the park. A memorial plaque was installed at a picnic area near the newly planted trees to honor Eugene's legacy and his connection to the community.







WALK THROUGH HISTORY

In September, Boy Scout Gregory Rubio proudly unveiled his Eagle Scout project: a three-sign memorial honoring the legendary Tuskegee Airmen. As trailblazing Black Air Force pilots of World War II, the Tuskegee Airmen hold a significant place in history, with their legacy tied to the local community through their training at Mather Field. SUPPORTING OUR SCHOOLS

This summer, CRPD demonstrated their commitment to community support through a school supply drive benefiting the Folsom Cordova Unified School District's (FCUSD) Families in Transition (FIT) Services program. With contributions from the CRPD Board of Directors and staff, over 700 items—including calculators, binders, art supplies and notebooks—were donated to help students facing insecurity. 
DISTRICT 1 - HAGAN COMMUNITY PARK PATHWAY


SPENDING PLAN BY EXPENSE CATEGORY


DISTRICT-WIDE SPENDING PLAN BY FUND
